Program Summary:

This seminar will provide an overview of the principles of successful treatment of individuals with co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders.

Target Audience:

New case managers and clinicians who have had little exposure to co-occurring disorders.

Program Goal:

To gain an understanding of Co-Occurring Psychiatric and Substance Use Disorders in Managed Care Systems

Objectives:

At the end of the program, the attendee will be able to:

1. Identify seven principles of successful treatment intervention.
2. Understand the basic concepts of welcoming, empathy, hope, integration, continuity and empathic detachment in engaging dually diagnosed adults/adolescents and their families.
3. Recognize the four quadrants, and their application to clinical care and system design.

Kenneth Minkoff, M.D.

Kenneth Minkoff, M.D. is a board-certified psychiatrist with a certificate of additional qualifications in addiction psychiatry; a dedicated community psychiatrist, and a clinical assistant professor of psychiatry at Harvard Medical School. He is recognized as one of the nation's leading experts on integrated treatment of individuals with co-occurring psychiatric and substance disorders, and on the development of integrated systems of care for such individuals through the implementation of a national consensus best practice model for systems design: the Comprehensive Continuous Integrated System of Care, referenced in SAMHS's Report to Congress on Co-Occurring Disorders.

Dr. Minkoff is a member of the Committee on Psychiatry and the Community for the Group for Advancement of Psychiatry (1982 - present), and chaired the committee for the report entitled: A Resident's Guide to the Treatment of People with Chronic Mental Illness (1993). He is also a fellow of the American Psychiatric Association and a member of the American Academy of Addiction Psychiatrists.
