V. CEO REPORT

MDHHS CCBHC Site Visit

The Department was here on May 31st for CCBHC site visit. Review was performed and overall everything appeared to go really well. As expected, there are a few things they would like to see from SCCMHA going forward and these items will be included in our plan of correction.

Summer Sponsored Respite Camps

Sandy also informed on activities this summer for kids. She brought a flyer for Gamechangers and also a table of Camp Names (Hartley, GameChanger and New Christ Community Church). A lot of the HCBS Rules are in effect as well so camps are being held in public spaces as part of integration efforts.

Enrollments (thru May)

CCBHC = 3491 BHH = 84 ISPA = 328 (leading MSHN!) – about 40% of anticipated SCCMHA enrollment

With workforce shortages this is having a toll on number of enrollments into WSA portal for ISPA (in entire CMH System not just SCCMHA).

Figuring out architecture of CCBHC (SUD in particular) and there are other CMHs likely to join demonstration in FY 24. Sandy continues to talk with others in MSHN to potentially collaborate in this effort.

Sandy Recognized by the Heart of the City Banquet

Banquet was held on June 8 at Horizons Conference Center and Sandy received the Impact Turnaround Award. It was an uplifting event honoring all the achievements and contributions of true heroes in our region.
